Background

The Just Energy Transition in Coal Regions - Interregional Platform (JET-CR Platform) is a core component of the project "*Innovation Regions for a Just Energy Transition*" (IKI JET), which aims to support coal-dependent regions tackle the socio-economic challenges associated with energy transitions. The JET-CR Platform is a joint German-EU initiative implemented in Chile, Colombia, Indonesia, Mongolia, South Africa, Thailand, and Viet Nam. The main goal of JET-CR is to create a network of coal regions to facilitate peer-to-peer exchange, strengthen policy dialogue and support the (co)creation of knowledge.

The IKI JET project organizes International Forums to strengthen policy dialogue amongst stakeholders from coal regions and the international community, focusing on critical issues related to just energy transition and sharing experiences. This year, the Forum is organized together with the project "*Just Transition to a Decarbonised Economy for South Africa*" (JUST SA) in Pretoria, South Africa, from October 14-15, 2024, in a hybrid form.

Target group

Decision-makers and stakeholders in coal regions (e.g. energy and mining companies, labour movement, civil society initiatives and NGOs).

Interpretation

The sessions will be livestreamed in English with simultaneous interpretation to Spanish, Bahasa Indonesian, Vietnamese, Thai, and Mongolian.

Objectives

- Present JET initiatives in the IKI JET partner countries, highlighting challenges, best practices, and experiences.
- Share insights on South Africa's policy experiences and the role of Small, Medium and Micro Enterprises (SMME) Facilities in the just transition agenda.
- Provide networking opportunities for stakeholders from IKI JET regions to connect with each other and with international communities.
